

Purpose

This code of conduct outlines the expectations of all athletes, judges, volunteers, vendors, and spectators participating in any event hosted or facilitated by No Fame Games, LLC. The safety of the athletes, their family and friends, and the audience is a top priority to us all.

Statement

Should any attendee previously described be suspected of behavior violating the expectations detailed below, **it is the right of No Fame Games to remove and/or deny entry to anyone on our fields.** We are proactive in creating and ensuring safety and comfort at our events for everyone involved.

Expectations

Respect the rights, dignity and worth of every attendee.

Treat all attendees equally and with respect.

Demonstrate understanding of relevant competition rules and seek the advice of others if necessary.

Cooperate fully with officials and competition organizers in the provision of fair and equitable conditions for the conduct of events.

Act in a decisive, objective but friendly manner in your interaction with other attendees and carry out your duties in an efficient and non-abrasive manner.

Under no circumstances should any attendee make any other feel uncomfortable via sexual advancement, sexual abuse, derogatory statements, or shameful expressions.

Never be visibly inebriated or showing physical/mental impairment to a degree that it affects your ability or competence to undertake your duties on the field.

Anyone caught using, displaying, or selling illegal substances on the field will be asked to leave and the appropriate authorities will be notified.

Never conduct negative interactions with others including attendees, audience members, and passersby.

Activities directed by you are appropriate for the age, maturity, experience and ability of attendee(s).

Avoid swearing and abusive language and irresponsible behavior including: behavior that is dangerous to yourself and others, acts of violence, bullying, harassment, and physical abuse.

Be fully prepared for the officiating task that is assigned to you.

Dress appropriately, to the standard and nature of the competition as outlined by the relevant officials.

Arrive in good time for the competition and report to the official in charge.

Conduct the event in accordance with the rules and with due respect to the welfare of the athlete.
